The Crosswalk Safety Society of Nova Scotia was registered in January 2016 to put more structure around our volunteer efforts to improve crosswalk safety, in particular the popular crosswalk flag program.

Norm Collins, crosswalk safety advocate Bill Campbell, President of Walk 'n Roll Halifax Brian Slaunwhite, who brought the idea back from Salt Lake City, after using flags there Scott Guthrie, the driver and coordinator behind many installations in Halifax, and Matt Spurway, a community minded resident of Dartmouth

The objectives of the Society are to:

- 1) promote crosswalk safety, and more generally pedestrian safety, through advocating for further education, enhanced enforcement and engineering initiatives in order to improve the visibility of crosswalks and pedestrians, and
- 2) facilitate community initiatives, e.g. crosswalk flag programs, in order to improve crosswalk safety.

Crosswalk flag installations are increasing across the province. There are currently 72 installations in HRM as well as a total of 22 in Port Williams, Hantsport, Windsor, Berwick, Aylesford, Chester, New Ross and Hubbards.

As a **Supporter** there is no annual fee and you will continue to receive our e-newsletter.
