

# The Crosswalk Safety Society of Nova Scotia

## Crosswalk flag installations

On March 23<sup>rd</sup> we installed the 100<sup>th</sup> crosswalk flag location in Nova Scotia (78<sup>th</sup> in HRM), generating considerable media coverage by CBC, CTV, Global, Metro News and Local Xpress.



Since then another six have been installed in Bedford at

- Basinview Drive at Madison Drive / Church Court
- Southgate Drive at Strathaven Close
- Southgate Drive at Ravines Drive
- Oceanview Drive at Royal Masts Way
- Moirs Mill Road at Acadia Mill Drive, and
- Larry Uteck Drive at Starboard Drive

Additionally there are another 10 approved and in the process of being installed

- Bedford Highway at Nelson's Landing, Bedford
- Bedford Highway at Spring Street, Bedford
- Bedford Highway (Sunnyside) across from MacDonald's, Bedford

- Tower Road at Atlantic Street, Halifax
- Gottingen Street at Falkland Street, Halifax
- Herring Cove Road at Sylvia Avenue, Spryfield
- Main Avenue at Hillcrest Street, Halifax
- Main Avenue at Alex Street, Halifax
- Willett Street at Westridge Drive, Halifax
- Dutch Village Road at Rufus Avenue, Halifax

As well we have been contacted by Sussex, New Brunswick who may be interested in six to eight locations and Bridgewater, Nova Scotia asking about three or four.
